Advocate for state's poor to give commencement address at Montevallo

also launched the Freedom of Information Unit to improve public access to government records, and she led a multi-agency effort to expand elder-abuse prosecutions.

Scott holds a bachelor's degree in history from the University of Florida and a juris doctorate with distinction from Emory University. She is a member of the California, Georgia and New York bars.
