Bridging Postsecondary Attainment and Workforce

Call for Proposals

Alabama College Attainment Network (AlabamaCAN) invites you to submit presentation proposals for the 3rd annual AlabamaCAN Spring 2023 Conference. The theme of the Conference is ***Changing the Narrative: Bridging Postsecondary Attainment and Workforce***.

In 2018, Alabama set a statewide attainment goal of adding 500,000 Alabamians with valuable postsecondary credential to the workforce by 2025. We are almost running out of time to meet that goal! The time for planning is done; now is the time to intentionally put into action initiatives that would actively support individuals towards this goal of postsecondary attainment while ensuring their career pathways are in the forefront!

The topics for presentations include:

- Postsecondary Access and Readiness
 - Presenters should consider submitting proposals around dual enrollment and early college opportunities; postsecondary access strategies; creating a college-going culture in elementary and middle schools
- Connecting College and Career Success
 - Presenters should look at submitting proposals around apprenticeships and work-based learning; stackable credentials; benefits of prior learning assessment; internships; career and technical education opportunities
- Student Success in Postsecondary Education
 - Presenters should consider submitting proposals around mental health; minimizing first-year dropout using effective programming; enrolling and retaining adult learners; Supporting Incarcerated Individuals Returning to Postsecondary Education by Reducing Recidivism; success strategies for students of color, under-resourced students, and first-generation students
- Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Belonging (DEIB)
 - Presenters should look at submitting proposals around DEIB strategies for effective communication; DEIB practices within your organization as well as for those you serve; eradicating pre-conceived biases from guiding decision-making process



- Policy, Advocacy, and Collective Impact
 - Presenters should consider submitting proposals around role and impact of student voice in advocating for effective policy change; impact of effective cross-sector collaborations for systems change

Presenters may include elementary/middle/high school educators, counselors, and administrators; representatives from community-based organizations and government agencies; researchers and faculty members at colleges and universities; diversity, equity, and inclusion practitioners; foundations and funders; and other education and workforce stakeholders. Presentations will be made during 45-minute breakout sessions **on a virtual platform**.

The proposal should be clear, concise and must include the following:

1. Session title that accurately reflects your session content (up to 12 words).
2. Brief session description (75-100 words).
3. Two (2) learning objectives that clearly describe what attendees will be able to demonstrate as a result of having attended the session. Each objective must be measurable/observable (up to 25 words per objective).
4. Detailed workshop description that includes what will be covered in the presentation; how it relates to the conference topic(s); and strategies that will be used to engage participants in discussing, analyzing, synthesizing, and applying the information from the presentation (500-word maximum).
5. Contact information for each presenter, including name, title, address, phone number, and email address.

Proposals are due by **Tuesday, February 21, 2023**, by 5 PM Central time and should be submitted online at alabamapossible.org/conferencepresentations. There is a peer-reviewed process for acceptance, and applicants will be informed of a decision by **Tuesday, March 14, 2023**.
